**The WHY:**  
Screening for HIV,  
Hep C, and Syphilis is  
an important part of  
complete healthcare.

Here are some  
guidelines for when  
to seek screening:

## HIV

**HIV is most commonly transmitted by:**

- Having sex without using condoms or medication to prevent HIV
- Sharing needles, syringes, or other drug injection equipment.
- HIV can pass from mother to child during pregnancy, childbirth or nursing without HIV treatment.

**Successful treatment of HIV can prevent transmission!**

## Syphilis

**Syphilis is most commonly transmitted by:**

- Sexually active people can get syphilis through vaginal, anal, or oral sex without a condom with a partner who has a syphilis infection.
- The presence of sores, rashes or ulcers may indicate syphilis infection.

**Syphilis can be cured with treatment, but you can get it again if exposed!**

## Hepatitis C

**Hepatitis C is most commonly transmitted by:**

- Sharing needles, syringes, or other drug injection equipment.
- Accidental injury by using needles or syringes.
- Receiving blood-based medical treatments prior to 1972.
- Sexual transmission is rare but possible.

**Successful treatment can cure HCV infection!**
